







Place these items in front of your child asking them what they are to ensure they know the names of the items. Then ask them to give an item to a particular character and place. If asking your child to "give the ball to the girl" this would require the child to follow 2 information carrying words. If you ask them to "put the ball in the girls bag" you have used 3 information carrying words. If you ask them to "put the ball and the robot in the girls bag" you have used 4 information carrying words. Remember to be careful not to provide additional clues like pointing or looking at the items unless you need to give your child extra help to succeed. You may need to show your child what to do many times to help them be successful. Your speech pathologist can show you how to do this if you are unsure.
